

DOING YOUR FAMILY GENEALOGY

Doing your family genealogy is somewhat like putting together the pieces of a large puzzle. It can be a very rewarding and challenging task. Unlike definite size of a puzzle, a family tree is always growing and changing. Many people work on their family history for a lifetime. Others tackle only a certain portion or a specific period of time. No matter which path you choose to pursue, a special experience awaits you. To help you begin your journey, the Jewish Historical Society has prepared helpful and basic guide.

Some basic rules to remember when beginning your family research:

- Talk to as many living relatives as you can - they are an important source of information.
- Be sure to verify important information with documentation.
- Purchase a few good Jewish genealogical books.
